Applicants should present a strong resumé of volunteerism and service to community along with academic achievement.
- Ana Resseguie-Barnes (\$500 – one available)  
For a student who maintains a 3.5 or better GPA and has demonstrated a strong level of school involvement, good character, and citizenship.
- Letha Munn (\$500 – one available)  
For a student with solid academic achievement and plans for a career in elementary teaching.
- Louise Reed (\$500 – one available)  
For a student with a solid academic record, a strong record of community service, and career plans in healthcare.
- Patrick and Lynn Vallier (\$500 – one available)  
For a student with a strong record of school and community involvement and service.
- Stanley Weinberg Farms (\$500 – one available)  
For a student who has a high level of involvement and achievement in agriscience or veterinary science and who plans to pursue a higher education degree in one of these fields.
- Lloyd (Todd) Cantwell (\$500 – one available)
